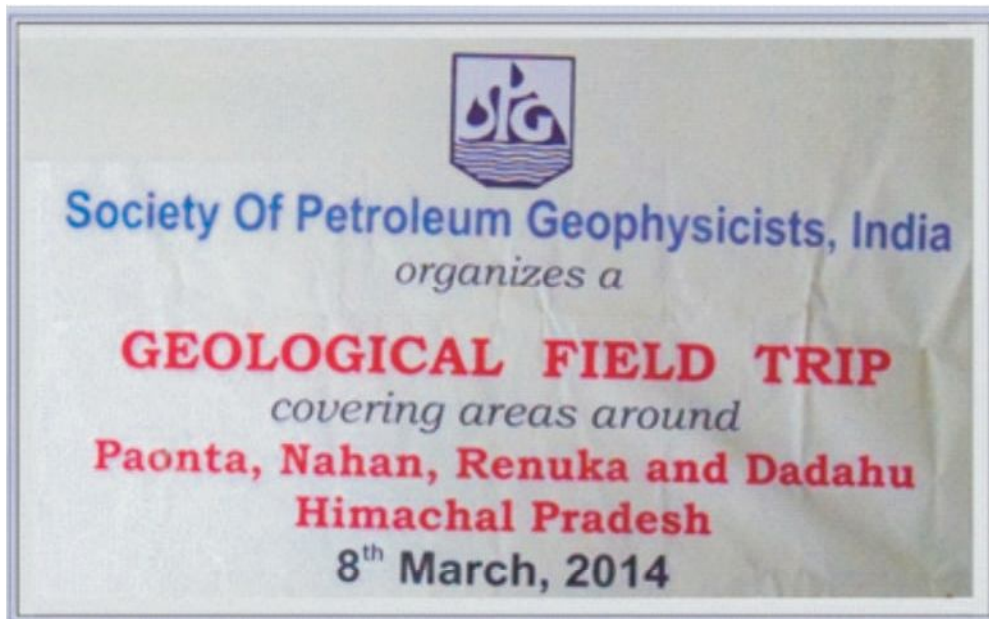


## SPG Dehradun organises a Geological Field Trip covering areas around Paonta, Nahan Dadahu and Renukaji - Himachal

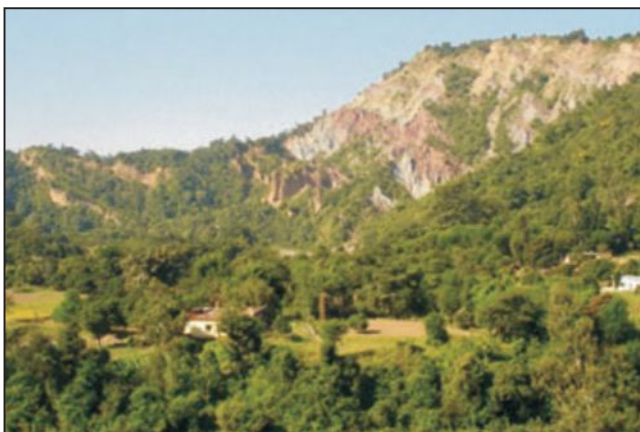

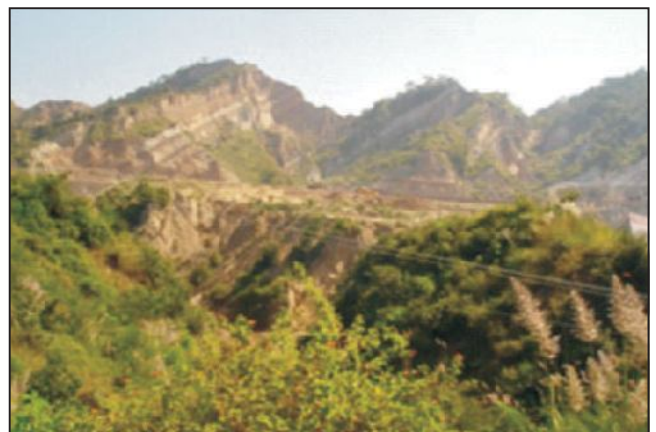




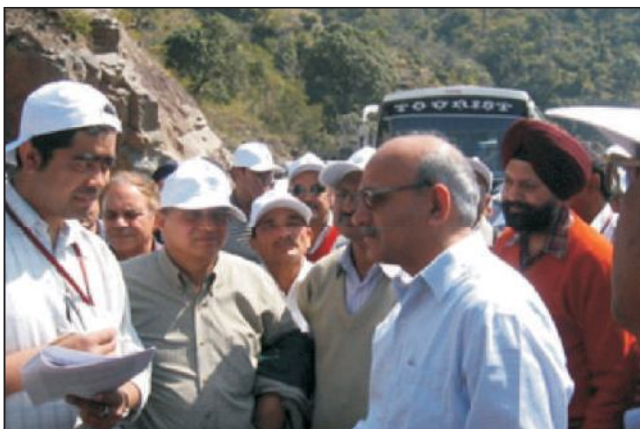
